How do we care for animals?


Who are my family?

Sticky Knowledge:

Here are some fabulous facts about our topic... Into the wild.

- A fish breathes under the water using gills.
- All amphibians begin their life in water with gills and tails. Examples are frogs and newts.
- Most reptiles lay eggs and their skin is covered with hard, dry scales
- Mammals are warm blooded animals that breath air and have a backbone.
- An animal needs food, water and shelter to survive.
- Where an animal lives is called a habitat. Some habitats are being destroyed and we should try to help the animals survive.
- Animals that tend to be awake during the night time are nocturnal.
