In Explorers, I learned...


- A farm is a piece of land used to grow crops and/or raise animals for produce. (Farms)

Sticky Knowledge:

- Cleopatra was the last pharaoh of Egypt before the Romans took over.
- Tutankhamun was known as the boy king, as he became a pharaoh at the age of 9
- Howard Carter discovered Tutankhamun's tomb in 1922, in the Valley of the Kings.
- Tombs contain a King's personal belongings which they want to take with them into the afterlife.
- Egyptian men and woman wore make-up.
- The Egyptians were the first civilizations to invent writing.
- The River Nile is the longest river in Africa.
- The Rosetta Stone, discovered in 1799, was written in hieroglyphs and two other languages, including ancient Greek, which linguists (language experts) could still read.
- Egyptians used to mummify dead bodies and place them in a sarcophagus (decorated coffin)
