What do I already know?

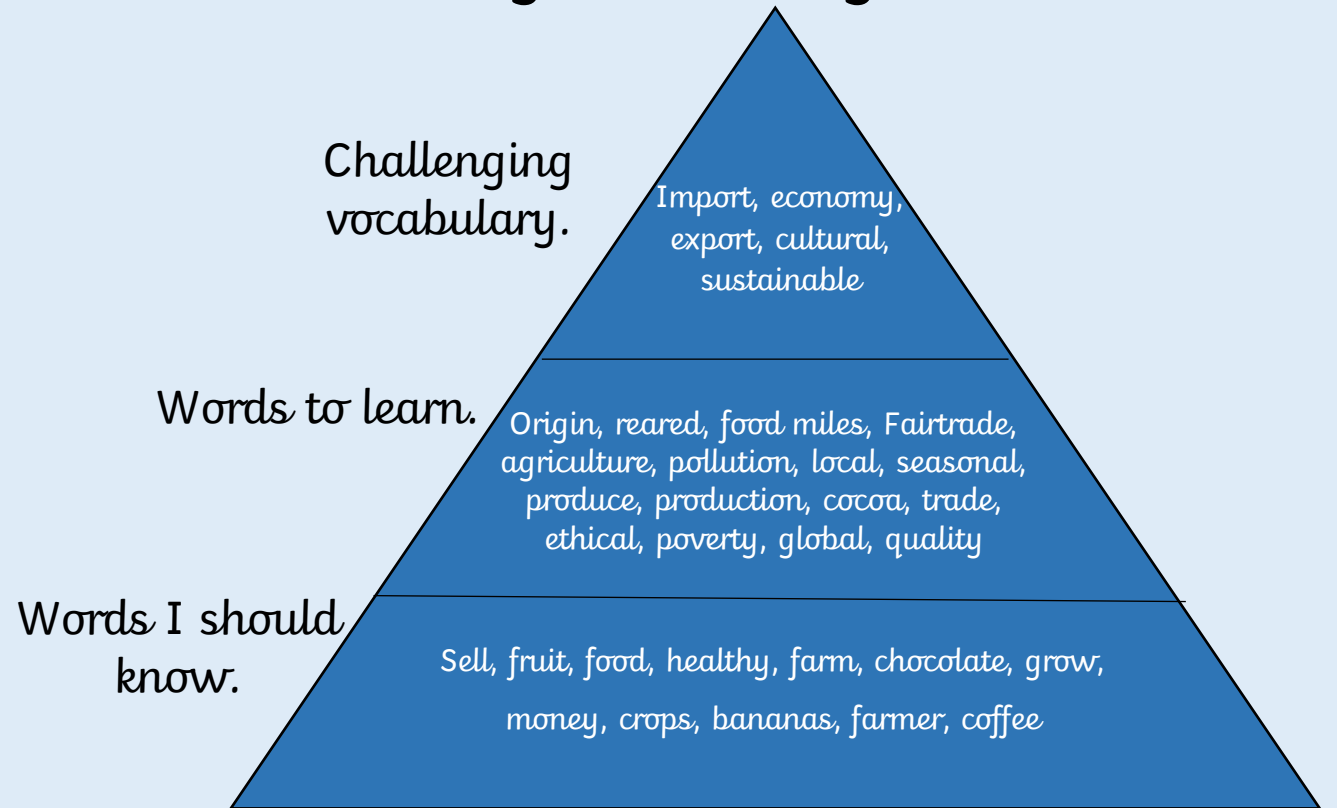
In Explorers, I learned that...

- A farm is a piece of land used to grow crops and/or raise animals for produce. (Farms)
- Each season is about three months long and they are: winter, spring, summer and autumn. (Farms)
- In Autumn, farmers bring in the harvest. Harvest is when crops are gathered. (Farms)
- Where an animal lives is called a habitat. Some habitats are being destroyed and we should try to help the animals survive. (Exploring Animals).
- Some people grow their own vegetables in an allotment. (Exploring Growing).
- Vegetables, fruit, plants, trees and animals (including humans) all grow. (Exploring Growing).
- Some vegetables grow in the ground and some fruits grow on trees. (Exploring Growing).

Sticky Knowledge:

- Fairtrade is a way of buying and selling products that allow the farmers to be paid a fair price for their produce and have better working conditions.
- The UK is part of the Northern Hemisphere.
- Food is imported and exported around the world, when it relies on a specific climate to grow in.
- Farmers produce food in the UK by growing crops and raising livestock.
- Buying and selling things is called trade.
- Goods are carried around the world in container ships and by aeroplane.
- The different climate zones are: polar, temperate, arid, tropical, Mediterranean and mountainous.
