What do I already know?

In Explorers, I learned...


- We are all special in our own way people help us, people give us advice and some people do things for us.
- Vicars and priests are important to some Christan believers as they teach us about the word of God.
- Guru Nanak is the person who found Sikhism.

In Philosophers, I learned...

- Christians believe Jesus is real (not like Disney heroes), and he died for a reason, and came alive again at Easter.
- Jewish people teach that Moses was a holy man. People all over the world have been inspired by Great religious leaders for many hundreds of years, in their millions
- 4 famous books about Jesus' life, called 'Gospels', are named for their writers: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John. They are in the Bible. 'Gospel' means 'Good News'.

What will I now learn?

- Outline Jesus' teaching on how his followers should live (A2).
- Offer interpretations of two of Jesus' parables and say what they might teach Christians about how to live (B3).
- Explain the impact Jesus' example and teachings might have on Christians today (B1).
- Express their own understanding of what Jesus would do in relation to a moral dilemma from the world today (C3).



Sticky Knowledge:

- Jesus was a 'man with a mission': he had 5 points: to give poor people good news, to free prisoners, to help the blind to see, to give liberty to oppressed people and to tell people God would bless them this year.
- The Bible places emphasis on love. One example is in 1
 Corinthians 13, known as Saint Paul's Letter about Love. This is
 a poem in the Bible which explains how we should treat one
 another.
- Jesus also taught his disciples and followers about 'agape love'. This means 'self-sacrifice love'. This means to love and treat others with respect and dignity.
- The western religions (Christianity, Judaism and Islam) believe that peace is brought about by an emphasis on peace in the community.
- We should encourage a cohesive community. This is where we work together. One way of promoting cohesion within communities is the promotion of fairer global food system.
- Christians often ask themselves, 'What would Jesus do?' when they encounter challenge or difficulty.

What was Jesus' mission?
