
## What do I already know?

# Sticky Knowledge: Banquets, Balls and Battles!

Here are some fabulous facts about our topic Banquets, Balls and Battles.

- The first and most famous castle in England was the tower of London. It was built by William the Conqueror between 1078 and 1097.
- In Medieval castles, the toilet was in the wardrobe! And, it was a seat with a hole in. The poop and wee would fall down the hole and drop into the moat around the castle. People thought that insects and bugs would stay away from their clothes because of the awful smell.
- Castles always had secret ways in and out.
   These were called the postern and would be used to escape if battles weren't going to plan!
- After winning battles, the winners would have a banquet which was a big party with lots of food, music and fun.
