What do I already know?

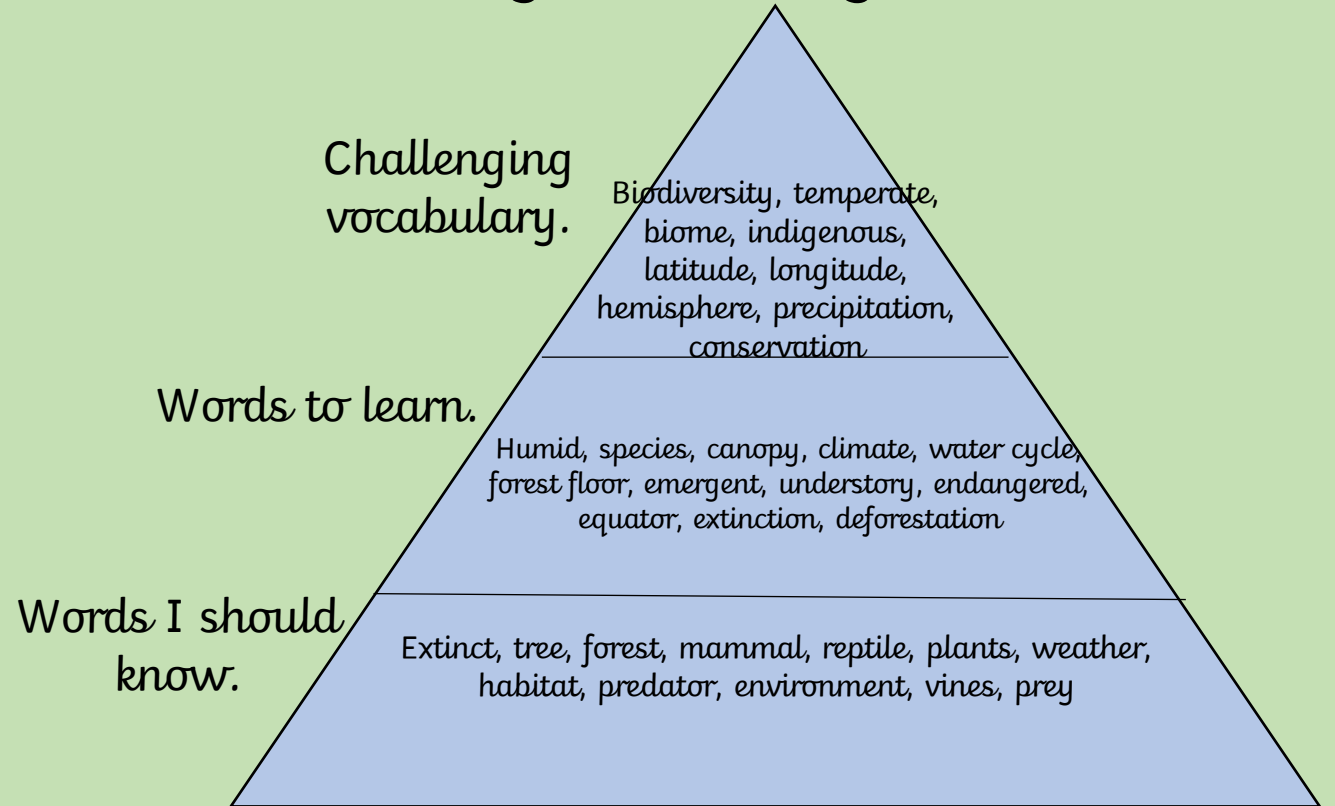
In Explorers, I learned...

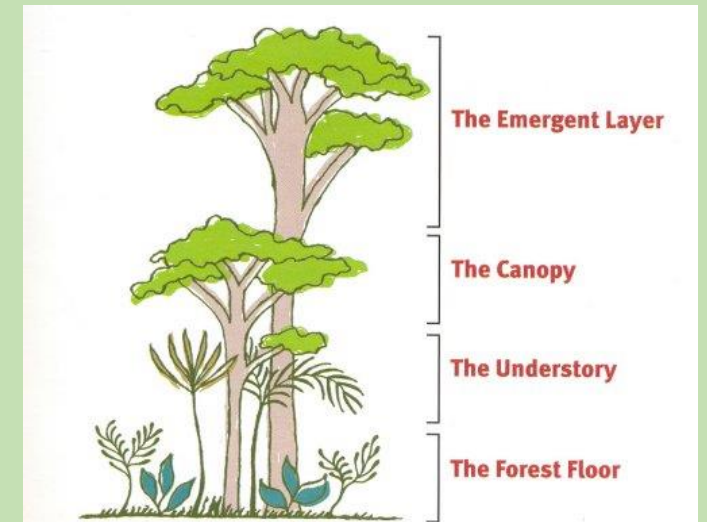

Sticky Knowledge:

- Rainforests are found near to the equator between the tropic of Cancer and the tropic of Capricorn.
- The Amazon Rainforest covers 5.5 million square km.
- There are 2.5 million insect species in the Amazon Rainforest
- The climate in the rainforest is the same all year round.
- It is hot and humid in the rainforest.
- There are 4 layers of the Rainforest: the forest floor, the understory, the canopy, the emergent.
- Deforestation means trees are cut down to allow space for: fields (to farm cattle), production of timber (to make furniture) and housing.
- Some examples of rainforest animals are:
 - leopards,
 - Tigers
 - Butterflies
 - Snakes
 - Toucans
 - Sloths
