

<u>Westhouses Primary School – RE Curriculum</u> <u>Progression, Vocabulary and Sticky Knowledge Document</u>



The Legal Framework of Religious Education:

Although there is not a National Curriculum for RE, all maintained schools must follow the National Curriculum requirements to teach a broad and balanced curriculum, which includes RE. All maintained schools therefore have a statutory duty to teach RE. The RE curriculum is determined by the local Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education (SACRE), which is responsible for producing the locally agreed syllabus for RE. Agreed Syllabuses used in schools (maintained or academy), which are not designated with a religious character must 'reflect the fact that the religious traditions in Great Britain are in the main Christian, while taking account of the teaching and practices of the other principal religions represented in Great Britain'. As a result, Westhouses Primary School teach from the Derbyshire and Derby City Agreed Syllabus for RE.

How have we structured our revised RE curriculum?

After reviewing the new 2020 syllabus, we have decided to structure our RE curriculum in a progressive way. Units at the beginning of each year will focus on specific religions and their beliefs, whereas units towards the end of the academic year will be thematic in approach, drawing together the knowledge and understanding gained from earlier units in the year and in previous years. Some units have also been split into two parts – this ensures that children will revisit key ideas periodically, embedding and developing understanding further. These units will be implemented and taught by all classes from the Autumn Term 2020, some units shall be trialled in the 2019-20 academic year.

How have we selected our focus religions?

As per the Derbyshire and Derby City revised syllabus, we have focused in on key religions, as identified in the most recent Census, and the religions and beliefs represented in our school. As per the syllabus, children in KS1 will focus on Christianity, plus one other religion (Judaism or Islam), and children in KS2 will focus on Christianity, Judaism, Islam and Hinduism, encompassing some non-religious views. Pupils in our Reception class will focus on the beliefs of children in the setting, but with a focus upon Christian views.

Assessment:

Planning will identify success criteria which show when children are working towards, expected or working at a greater depth. Assessment should be used each lessons to identify misconceptions and support/ challenge children as appropriate. When units are related, children who did not meet the expected standard should be given the opportunity to make accelerated progress in the next unit of learning. Assessments are logged on the school tracking system at the end of each academic year, providing a final summative assessment based upon the year's learning.

Progression:

Each colour shows units which link together across EYFS, KS1 and KS2. These units cover similar themes, which build upon prior learning. For additional information, see the Derbyshire Syllabus for learning outcomes. In red, each unit outlines the specific religions which should be covered in depth.
