


Help children listen to and rehearse the French spoken word. Foster a curiosity and help deepen their understanding of the world around us.

miliar subjects and routines and also provides for cross curricular links. This allows children to make connections and apply their language skills to other areas of their learning.

Lessons incorporate a range of teaching strategies from independent tasks, paired and group work including role-play, language games, songs and language detective work. Pupils' learning is evidenced through the use of the class floor book. This book has examples of key vocabulary and grammatical structures, which will be a key resource to support children when reviewing previously learnt concepts. These books may include images, key vocabulary, scripts and QR codes which link to pupils practising speaking in French. Additional work may be saved onto pupil Seesaw accounts.

Teachers' knowledge and skills are developed through the use of ongoing CPD videos for each unit on the Kapow online scheme.

Support for children with SEND or additional needs.

Although we expect that the majority of children will have successfully met the national curriculum objectives by the end of the year, we recognise that some children may benefit from further instruction. Interventions will look different for different children. The list below is not exhaustive; you may see:
